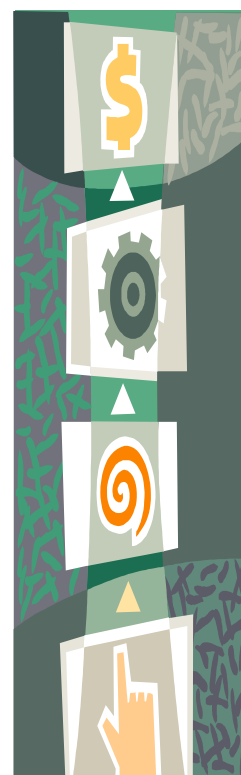

PROFILE

In the year 2000, Neal and the Montgomery Baptist Association in Montgomery, Alabama, in cooperation with the Alabama Baptist Convention and the North American Mission Board (appointed SBC missionary in 2000), began the Community of Hope, a Multihousing Church Planting Ministry and Network (**H**elping **O**thers **P**repare for **E**ternity). From this ministry, many lay people have been trained to start churches in their “Jerusalem” through the Great Commission Institute offered by HOPE. In 2005, NAMB asked their appointed missionary to make his base in Atlanta and begin mission laboratories across North America, training more believers to embrace their community with the love of Christ, and establish indigenous led churches. In January 2008, Neal joined a new team at NAMB called the Urban Team. He works with SBC partners as a consultant to the metro communities of the United States, Canada and their tributaries.

My Story: When I was a little boy I was quite sure that there must be a God in the universe; however, I knew nothing further about Him. After I entered my university, *I began my long journey to find the true belief.*

Buddhism has a deep root in my culture, and you can find temples around you, so beliefs in Buddhism became my first choice. At that time I believed it totally, and it formed my fundamental principle of my life for quite a long time.

The luckiest thing in my life took place in the end of 2004, that I met my girlfriend, now my dear wife. She had been a real Christian for three years. My wife suffered much due to the different beliefs between us. Fortunately, supported by her own love and the heavenly love from Jesus, she overcame the suffering, introducing me to books like *Purpose Driven Life* and praying for me often.

Last year I came here as a post doctoral associate, and I began coming to church for the Bible study and worship every Sunday, with my wife. I could understand the Bible and believed Jesus is a God who is so great to sacrifice himself for saving the people; however *I was not sure whether Jesus is my God and whether I can be saved through Him.* The cultural difference blocked me very much, for I thought I, a man from the East, should be saved by an eastern belief. Fortunately, thanks to the Bible study, my hardened heart was touched when I read the wise words of Jesus.

My research was challenging for me because I was not familiar with the new environment and not so good at English. I sometimes needed to work overtime. When facing great difficulty, there were two choices in front of me: let it be because it is really hard, or strive to solve it to make my research better. Gradually I felt my previous belief could not comfort me any more, for I could not find any meaning in my hard work. I began to wonder whether Buddhism is the right way to save me. In history most of the successful Buddhists are monks & nuns, who stay in temples & meditate every day, but for the common people like me, it is hard to find balance between belief & life.

This April my wife and I went back home. On the airplane, the only book I took is a Bible, but I just wanted to learn English. Some time later we went to the U.S. Embassy to apply for a return visa to America. We believed it should be very smooth, but the officer said "You need a clearance, which usually takes three weeks." That is the beginning of our tough time. My wife's air ticket expired, so we had to buy a new one. My salary and benefits ceased. Furthermore, we had to pay for the rented rooms in both places. The only

thing we could do is wait. Every morning I checked whether there was information from the Embassy. Four weeks passed, but nothing. The Embassy said it might take six months.

In every day that followed, our life was in a cycle of waiting and being disappointed. I fell into deep anxiety. I asked, *Who could help me? Who could help me find back the patience in my heart? Who could give me that kind of peace, not temporary but eternal, working not only when I am successful, but also when I experience the hardest time, even face death, sickness or complete failure?* I thought it over & over. For more than ten years, I had never stopped seeking for the true belief. I tried, experienced, suffered, and failed. I thought the right time for me to determine was coming, so I prayed. I said in my heart, *"The creator of the whole universe. You are the father of compassion, mercy, peace and justice. I do not know who you are, but I know you can hear me. Please give me three days, in which please guide me to find the true belief, true way. Please block the wrong beliefs outside, and only allow the right one to touch me. Please."*

On the second day following my prayer, I watched the film "Jesus" from the internet. I was moved by one sentence in that movie, "He is a completely righteous man. He never sinned in his whole life". I thought only the person who never sins can possess the eternal peace. Yes, this is what I am looking for!

Subsequently, I prayed with my wife to claim the beginning of my Christian life. Every night before we slept, we prayed as a son and daughter talked with their father, submitted us to Him, and asked Him to guide and arrange our life. We believe His wisdom is much higher than ours. I felt much better even in the following days waiting for the visa, because I believed God had His own plan. After 40 days from the application, we got our visa and came back here.

Guided by Jesus, I have found the balance between my research & belief. I think God gave people different abilities & gifts, and we should use ours to please Him. If we can do that, we must be doing the best thing to benefit the human society, too. So I work hard, not for myself, but for God.

Now I am living a refreshed life. Here I'd like to share my experience with you, brothers and sisters. I think, human beings are always limited; no matter how strong or intelligent you are, you cannot overcome the world. There are always some mountains you cannot climb up, burdens you cannot lift, suffering you cannot bear, and things making you fall in despair. Only Jesus, who has overcome the whole world by his passion and justice, can be depended on and trusted forever. God not only is willing to love you, but also has the power and ability to help you. Maybe sometimes God's plan is different with your expectation, but you know the father always gives the best to the son.
